## *Following Jesus: Invitation to Discipleship*



Discipleship is an ongoing  
journey of conversion.

Here are 5 stages of conversion:\*

**Trust** – having a positive relationship with someone/something in the Church

**Curiosity** – wanting to know more about the life and teachings of Jesus or the Christian faith

**Openness** – being open to the possibility of personal and spiritual change

**Seeking** – actively seeking to know the will of God for one's life

**Intentional discipleship** – making an intentional decision to follow Jesus as a disciple and to reorder one's life accordingly

God loves each of us, wherever we are on our faith journey, and invites us to take the next step.

\*There are different models for this process of conversion. This one comes from the book *Forming Intentional Disciples* by Sherry Weddell.

**From the Desk of Father Dave****Forgiveness and the Spiritual Works of Mercy**

Forgiveness is a process. Hopefully throughout our lives we will learn to forgive and to ask for forgiveness as a natural part of living, I believe three Spiritual Works of Mercy can help us with that. They are **forgiving injuries, bearing wrongs patiently, and admonishing the sinner**. All are part of the process of healing.

**Forgiving injuries** allows us to mend relationships. Often when we have resentments it is like taking poison and waiting for the other person to die. Grudges never help us. Any good we feel is temporary and most often it is the pain that endures. In order for forgiveness to work it has to be a two way street, but we can help the process by making the first move. Even if we take out the notion of what we are supposed to do; let's ask ourselves how does not pursuing forgiveness benefit us? Wouldn't we be healthier if we implemented forgiveness?

When we have been wronged, we need to practice **bearing wrongs patiently**. The key factor is to not get bitter. If someone gets to you, step back from the situation and pray for patience. We are called to join our struggles to the cross of Christ. We will sometimes need to suffer; it is just part of the human condition. We should try to view these moments in the most positive light possible. We shouldn't just offer things up with no hope, but we need to realize that suffering in the short term may benefit us in our view of redemption.

The last spiritual work of mercy I wish to write about can be very tricky. Sometimes in granting forgiveness we may be called to make a point about not wanting this person to do it again. Sometimes we even need to make clear what it was the person did to hurt us. So at times we must **admonish the sinner**. We do this realizing we are all sinners. This can hopefully be done in a loving, sincere, and helpful way. Sometimes this can be called fraternal correction. We hope that the correction can be done in a way that is life giving to the one being corrected. This can help us from falling into patterns of sin. When we are corrected we have a greater possibility of growth. When we admonish, we are letting our feelings be known while trying to help the dignity of the other person.

In Ruthie's family, when someone is whining about something, you will often hear expressed, "Would you like some cheese with that whine?" As human beings, we are often quick to whine and complain more than we are to express thankfulness. It is as if we are not pleased unless we have something about which to be miserable. In all of the readings today, there is not one instance in which we hear a complaint uttered. Naaman, afflicted with a life altering disease, is cured and he offers thanks to God. St. Paul, imprisoned and in chains, utters thanksgiving for having been worthy to suffer for the Gospel which offers freedom to all people. The Samaritan, having been cured of leprosy, returns to give thanks to Jesus for being healed.

The negativity which pervades our society is poisonous. As the venom from a snake attacks and kills the body, so the prevailing negativity turns human hearts into stone. We seem to be negative about everything, even to the most mundane things in life. For instance, we whine and complain to each other about candidates during this election cycle. However, we fail to appreciate the freedom our Constitution grants us to express our sentiments openly without any fear of reprisal or imprisonment for ourselves and our family members and freely elect those we believe worthy for public office. We have much for which to be grateful in our nation.

These three readings challenge us to rid ourselves of the poison of negativity to become people of gratitude. We have a God that chose us to be his daughters and sons. We have a God that loves us so much that Jesus became the living expression of God's love for us. We have a God that loves us so much that he wants us to be with him forever. As Catholic Christians, let us strip from ourselves all this negativity and choose to put on the garment of joy and gratitude as disciples of Jesus Christ.

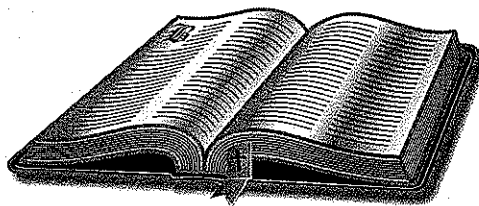

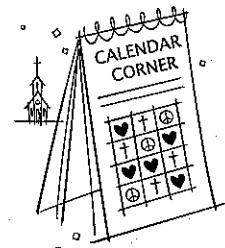
