who gave their best when they were called upon to serve and protect their country.

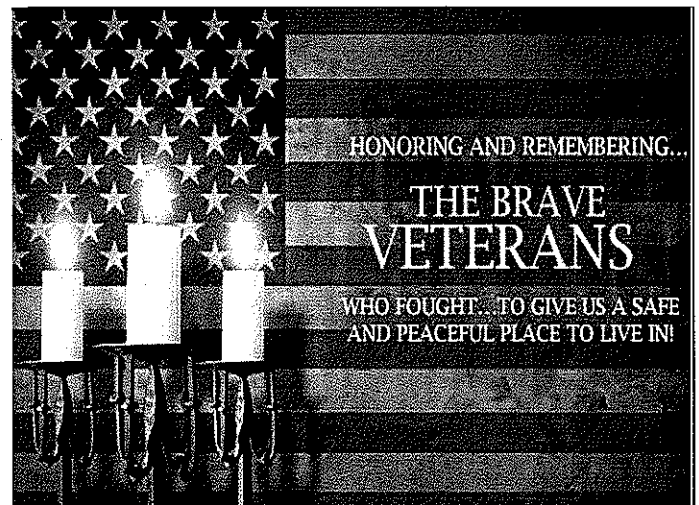
We pray that you will bless them, Lord, for their unselfish service in the continual struggle to preserve our freedoms, our safety, and our country's heritage, for all of us.

From the Desk of Father Kevin**Getting the Balance Right: Doctrine & Mercy**

When the Second Vatican Council opened in the early 1960's, St. Pope John XXIII urged his fellow bishops to apply the "medicine of mercy" to the life of the church. From that point of departure, the Council began its work of bringing the church more into harmony with the Gospel of Jesus and the will of the Holy Spirit.

Pope Francis, a year ago, announced a "year of mercy" whose observance will conclude this month. Pope Francis asked us to focus on "mercy" in order to bring into proper balance the life of the church. He has learned much from the education he received in the barrios of Argentina. Immersing himself in the realities and practical lives of poor people, he developed an extraordinary pastoral sensitivity to people. He knows that God, in loving us, approaches us with mercy and love FIRST and then benevolent judgment and guidance follow. The love of God always meets us exactly where we are and then guides us to where we need to go.

So, what role does DOCTRINE and TRUTH have to do with our spiritual lives? Every religion has doctrinal teachings which focus the understanding of its religious view. Doctrine is important because it guides our conscious minds in growing our understanding of the mystery that is God. But the Christian God is first a God of love, not a God of information about God. As St. Paul writes, "if we have faith to move mountains, but have not love, we are a noisy gong or a clanging symbol." God's desire for us is first about having relationship with God, not just straightening out our thinking about who God is.

All religions have trouble with getting the "balance right" between doctrine and mercy. At times religious systems use "doctrine" to bludgeon people and at times even take their lives. [Note what sent Jesus to his execution. Note what flew the airplanes into the New York Twin Towers. Note the doctrine of the Nazi's that sent millions to their death.] Pope Francis is not changing the "doctrine" of the church. He is asking that "mercy" drive the church's bus with "doctrine" and other things guiding where mercy may take us. But mercy must be first.

For these reasons, church leaders are to "smell like their sheep" and get out of the church sacristy and into the street with their people. The church leaders are to "accompany" people on their spiritual journey. The church community is to open itself to reality by taking itself out to the "margins of society" and walking in the "moccasins of the poor". It is what Jesus did and, we might note, got in trouble for. To accompany anyone, especially those different from how we see things, requires lots of listening and openness to dialogue in the great diversity of our global village. Pope Francis in this "Year of Mercy" has challenged us to be more "catholic" in our communities and use the "medicine of mercy" that St. Pope John XXIII prescribed as the Second Vatican Council began its work. We in 2016 continue to unfold the Holy Spirit's guidance that was initiated by that great Council of our church.

Without God we are nothing, but with God we have the opportunity to feed the world and be a part of a strong community. This weekend we are celebrating these notions and we thank God for the harvest. LE SUEUR COUNTY - ADOPT-A-FAMILY FOR CHRISTMAS

For over twenty-five years, this program has operated through St. Wenceslaus Parish. We receive assistance from the Lutheran churches in New Prague, and Methodist, Lutheran, Catholic, and Presbyterian churches in Montgomery, Le Center, Le Sueur, Kasota, and Cleveland. Several local schools also participate.

In October, forms were sent out from the county Department of Human Services. Parents fill out the forms listing their children's ages and sizes of **clothing and outerwear gift choices**. The forms are forwarded to a St. Wenceslaus YAC group where they are numbered and names are removed to respect the privacy of the families. Families, individuals, or groups choose a child or family to shop for. The gifts will be distributed to the families on Saturday, December 10th at five locations in Le Sueur County.

We have also teamed up with the Le Sueur County Santa Anonymous program to provide toys, books, games, and other non-clothing items for the families. This program gives parents the opportunity to pick out gifts suitable for their own children on December 12th at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Le Center.
