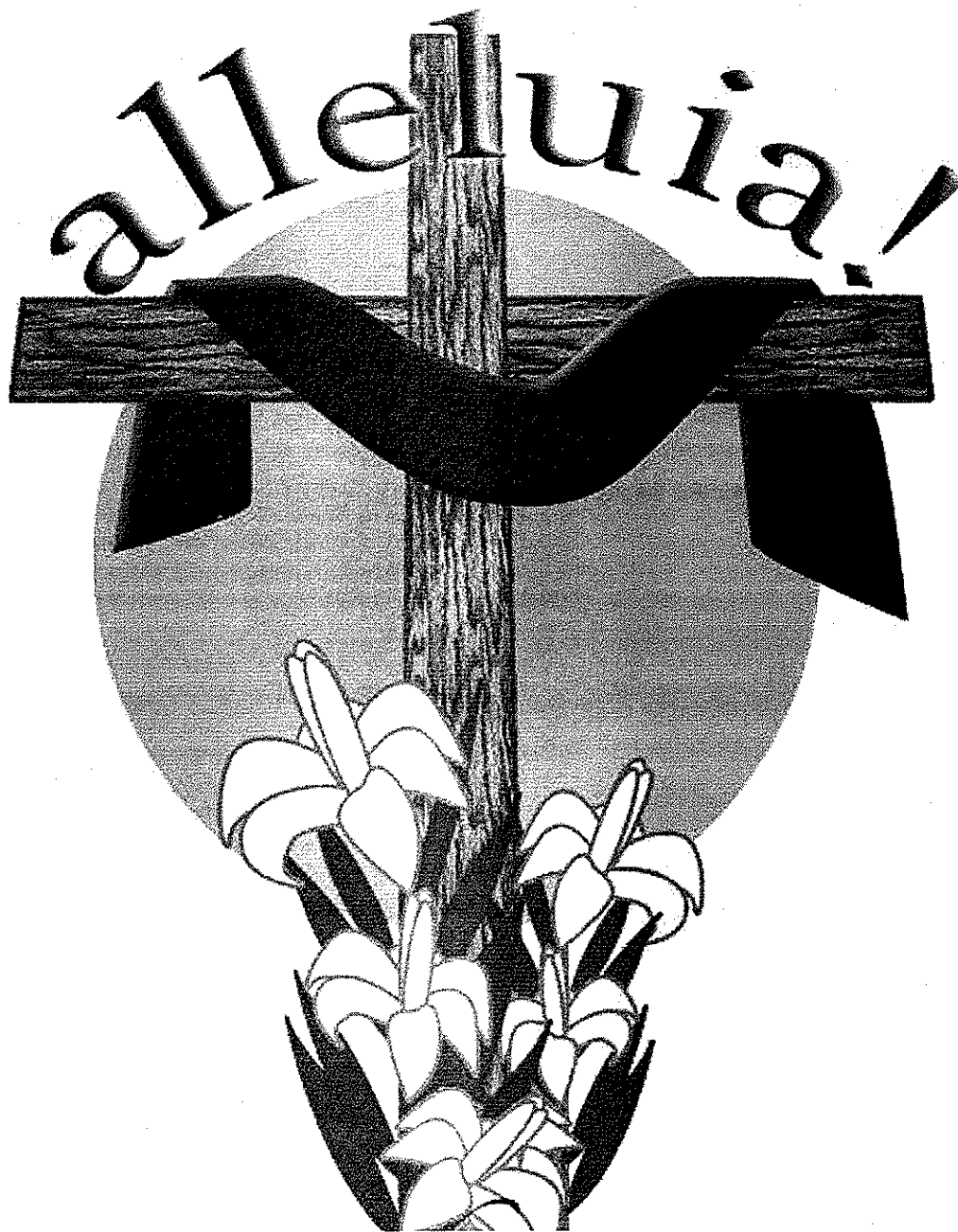

From the Desk of Father Kevin**Happy Easter to All!**

During Easter we celebrate the greatest event in human history ~ the resurrection of Jesus Christ! The power of death has been conquered by the power of love. From the Desk of Deacon Bob

In a poetry class in college, I studied a poem by the American poet, James Wright. It was entitled "Saint Judas". The poet found that in reading the New Testament, the death of Judas Iscariot is mentioned in only two accounts; Matthew's Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles (the Gospels of John, Luke, and Mark, while acknowledging his betrayal of Jesus, never mention his death). The manner of Judas' death is different in the two accounts. In Wright's poem, Judas, on his way to end his life, encounters hoodlums beating and robbing a man. Shaken by the sight the poem continues...

*"Banished from heaven, I found this victim beaten,
Stripped, kneed, and left to cry. Dropping my rope
Aside, I ran, ignored the uniforms;
Then I remembered bread my flesh had eaten,
The kiss that ate my flesh. Flayed without hope,
I held the man for nothing in my arms."
(Collected Poems of James Wright)*

In this poem, the death of Jesus not only saved the world, but even saved the life and the soul of the one who betrayed him. Judas, no longer ruled and controlled by avarice, finds his life emulating that of the one he betrayed. He has become a man of compassion and love.

On this Easter Sunday, where do we find ourselves? Do we find ourselves with the brave women, Mary Magdalene, Mary, the mother of James, and Salome going to the tomb of Jesus? Do we find ourselves in the person of Peter, crushed by his denial of Jesus? Do we find ourselves numbered with the apostles fearing for their lives cowering in the upper room? Or, do we find ourselves, as in this poem, with Judas Iscariot, who believes his sin has damned him for all time? It matters not with whom we find ourselves. The death, passion, and resurrection of Jesus has brought salvation to humanity. All we need to do is believe and embrace Jesus, the One who is the way, the truth, and the life.

SWS STAFF SHOWCASE

Ann Christy ~ 5th Grade Teacher

Ann Christy is our SWS 5th grade teacher. A life-long learner, Ann says the most important thing she has ever learned is to listen to the Spirit. She is a proud SWS alum who earned her BA degree in Elementary Education/Psychology from St. Catherine University. Just weeks after graduating, Ann received a mysterious call about a position teaching junior high Religion and Science. Laughing to herself, she replied, "No, thank you." However, with few elementary teaching jobs available, Ann ended up working in the health insurance industry, relocating to Texas for 7 years. She enjoyed helping people but revealed in opportunities to teach others. Landing back in New Prague with a good TX drawl, Ann substitute taught for a year and was then hired as a 2nd grade teacher at SWS. Nine years later, she followed her students upstairs and taught 5th grade for three years while earning her Master's degree in Education. THEN, Ann was asked to consider teaching junior high Religion. Remembering the call 22 years earlier, Ann reluctantly agreed to try it. She admits that her 15 years of teaching junior high Religion are some of her most rewarding; however, having learned to listen to the Spirit, Ann relinquished that role and returned to 5th grade, where she has taught for the last 2 years and earned her STEM certificate. Ann loves challenging her students to observe and think about the world around them and to take learning into their own hands. Ann has one adult son, Jerrod, who lives and works in the area. When not teaching, you may find Ann running off to Guatemala with high school students in tow.

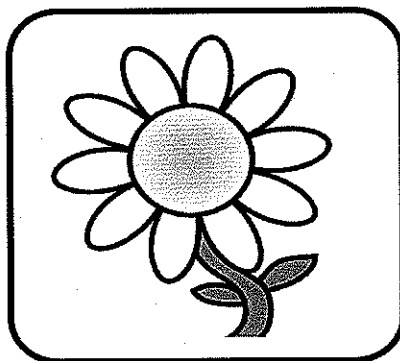

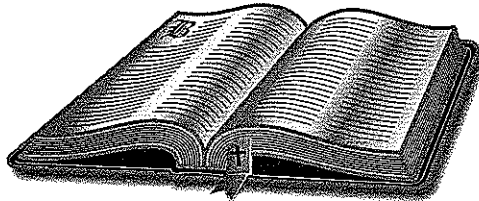

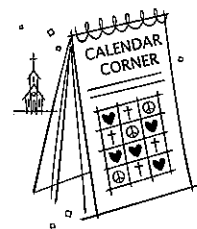
