Ash Wednesday

Next Wednesday is Valentines' Day... but more importantly it is the beginning of Lent! Ash Wednesday begins the 40 days of Lent... Now if you count the days between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday, you will arrive at 46... Sundays are considered a mini-Easter and therefore we do not count them in our 40 days. Please talk with your children about Lent... it is never too early to get the focus on Jesus. Should they "give something up?" May-be... if it helps them grow in their relationship with Jesus. Give up 30 minutes of screen time, but replace it with prayer or helping someone out with the thought of living as Jesus would want us to. Give up candy? Take the money that would have been spent on candy and donate it to the Peace Center or another worthy cause, share with those less fortunate.



Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving are the three main areas of focus during Lent. You can model for your children as to how you are working on these areas... individually or as a family. A good time to dig a bit deeper.
