From the Desk of Mary Higgins**We Must Not Turn Away**

In late summer, we watched the great destruction caused by hurricanes as they hit islands in the Caribbean and the southern US and by two major earthquakes in Mexico causing catastrophic loss of life and property. Most recently, we were devastated by news of the gun violence in Las Vegas that killed and injured so many.

A great danger in all of this is that we can become overwhelmed and immune to the pain and suffering of others, in a kind of compassion fatigue. Pope Francis, in his homily during a recent morning Mass, said that we need to have true compassion so we feel others' pain and are moved to help. "Compassion is an emotion that engages, a feeling from the heart, from the gut," affecting one's entire being," he said. "Compassion is not the same as pity or (saying), 'What a shame, poor people ...' but leaving things as they are." The word "compassion" means to "suffer with," he said, and this is compassion's true meaning.

He reflected on the Gospel from St. Luke, which told of Jesus encountering a widow mourning the death of her only son — her only hope of support and survival. Instead of worrying about the crowd that had accompanied him and using that as an excuse to move on, Jesus was more concerned about the tragic plight of the widow right in front of him.

"Why?" Pope Francis asked. "Because his heart, his whole inner being got wrapped up" in the situation, which drove him to get close and become involved, to reassure the woman and perform the miracle of bringing the son back to life ~ to restore human life. God had compassion for his people, went to them through his son, Jesus, and restored their dignity as children of God.

Christians, he said, must follow Christ's example: look at reality, be moved by it and get close to those in need. Pope Francis asked us to reflect on our reaction when we read or hear news about tragedies. "Do I turn the page and move on?" he asked. Or "am I able to have compassion? To pray?" so that when one sees or hears about these tragedies, one's whole being is moved and "the heart suffers with these people."

As we enter into silence and the great heart of God in our prayer, we feel the pain. And we do what we can. It might be sending a donation, praying for the victims, contacting our representatives to encourage needed changes in laws, or extending kindnesses to those close to us. We must not turn away.

"As we have received mercy, we don't lose heart." 2 Corinthians 4:1,

Chili Cook Off

When I was in seminary, one time we had a chili cook off. Two of my friends and I entered the contest with a recipe we sort of made up. We called the concoction Double Meat Chili. Mark and Eugene were my teammates and we crafted a chili recipe that included navy beans, ground beef, and just the right amount of kick in the broth. My secret weapon was to slow cook an arm roast with onion and garlic to give the meat a nice savory flavor. I then chopped it up and put it in the simmering pot. The arm roast added a new and different texture to the standard chili. We won the contest hands down.

I believe this chili can be an analogy for our parish. The WCC, because different small communities are coming together, adds a distinctive flavor to our parish. We are having listening sessions in the WCC coming up to help us keep our integrity. If we can be strong, we can thrive as small, rural faith communities. I hope and pray as many of you as possible can be a part of those sessions. 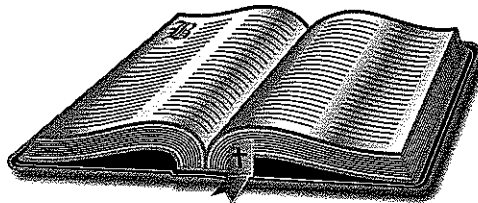

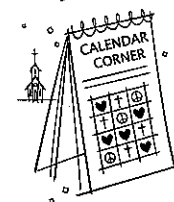
