

Second Hand Preacher 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time 10 29 17

1 Thessalonians 1:5c-10

Role models can sometimes be hard to come by. You hear about athletes, movie stars, or politicians who have lived seemingly good lives and then all of a sudden you learn something horrible about them. This fact tarnishes them and sometimes we stop following them or even paying attention to what kind of activity they are doing. The simple fact is no one is 100% perfect. Everyone has some sort of flaw. The hero works to overcome their flaws. They often learn from their weaknesses and sometimes those imperfections become strengths.

There is one who is perfect and that is Jesus the Lord. We should all follow him. We should all be imitators of him and all he did in his short life on earth. We should think about what he taught and how he treated people. We should marvel at the great love he had for us even to the point of dying on the cross for our sins.

St. Paul wants the Christians of Thessalonica to imitate the missionaries that had been and even more so Jesus who is their redeemer.
